

## House Concurrent Resolution No. 5033

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9 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION urging the United States to with-  
10 draw from the Security and Prosperity Partnership of North America  
11 and the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA).  
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13 Whereas, President George W. Bush entered into the Security and  
14 Prosperity Partnership (SPP) of North America with the nations of Mex-  
15 ico and Canada on March 23, 2005; and

16 Whereas, On March 31, 2006, a White House news release confirmed  
17 the continuing existence of the SPP and its “ongoing process of cooper-  
18 ation”; and

19 Whereas, The economic and physical security of the United States is  
20 impaired by the potential loss of control of its borders attendant to the  
21 full operation of NAFTA; and

22 Whereas, A NAFTA highway system from the west coast of Mexico  
23 through the United States and into Canada has been suggested as part of  
24 a merger into what is called the North American Union (NAU) and the  
25 broader plan to advance the Security and Prosperity Partnership; and

26 Whereas, Future unrestricted foreign trucking into the United States  
27 can pose a safety hazard due to inadequate maintenance and inspection  
28 and can act collaterally as a conduit for the entry into the United States  
29 of illegal drugs, illegal human smuggling and terrorist activities; and

30 Whereas, State and local government throughout the United States  
31 would be negatively impacted by the SPP and NAU process, such as the  
32 “open borders” vision of the SPP, eminent domain takings of private  
33 property along the planned highways and increased law enforcement  
34 problems along those same highways; and

35 Whereas, A NAFTA highway system would be funded by foreign con-  
36 sortiums and controlled by foreign management, which threatens the sov-  
37 ereignty of the United States; and

38 Whereas, This trilateral partnership to develop a North American Un-  
39 ion has never been presented to Congress as an agreement or treaty, and  
40 has had virtually no Congressional oversight: Now, Therefore,

41 *Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Kansas,*  
42 *the Senate concurring therein:* That the Kansas Legislature urges the  
43 United States Congress, especially the Kansas Congressional delegation,

1 to use all of their efforts, energies and diligence to withdraw the United  
2 States from any further participation in the Security and Prosperity Part-  
3 nership of North America and the North American Free Trade Agree-  
4 ment; and

5 *Be it further resolved:* That the Kansas Legislature urges Congress to  
6 withdraw the United States from any other bilateral or multilateral activ-  
7 ity, however named, which seeks to advance, authorize, fund or in any  
8 way promote the creation of any policy or structure to accomplish any  
9 form of North American Union as described in this resolution; and

10 *Be it further resolved:* That the Secretary of State be directed to send  
11 enrolled copies of this resolution to the President of the United States,  
12 the President of the United States Senate, the Speaker of the United  
13 States House of Representatives and each member of the Kansas Con-  
14 gressional delegation.
