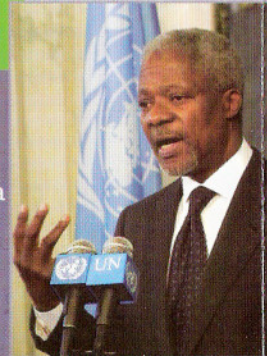


## UNA-USA IS A FORCE FOR CHANGE

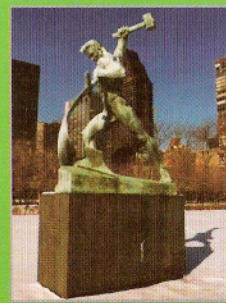
UNA-USA's National Council, an advisory body of prominent Americans, is co-chaired by Presidents Jimmy Carter and Gerald Ford.
