On November 1, 2010 OK-SAFE filed an Open Records request to the Office of State Finance, seeking more detailed information about the state's contract with Cappemini, the global consulting, technology, and outsourcing firm, headquartered in Paris, France.

This Open Records request asked for:

1. Any literature, both written and/or electronic, provided to the Office of State Finance, the Chief Information Officer, Representative Jason Murphey, Representative David Derby, or any other state elected official, by Kevin Doyle of Capgemini, or any other representative thereof.

OSF Response on 11/12/2010: You will have to contact the Oklahoma House of Representatives or the Representatives directly to obtain information from them, as it is a separate branch of the Oklahoma government. Also, you should be aware that the Oklahoma House is not subject to the Oklahoma Open Records Act and is not required to provide any of the information you requested. However, they may provide you information if they choose to do so. Your request for information from any other state elected official contains the same infirmity in that all other state elected officials are in other state agencies and OSF has no ability or authority to fulfill information requests for them.

2. The source of the language used in the Solicitation Working Document contained in the RFP entitled CIO Study, dated June 2010. Please include the name of the entity providing the language, the source of the language, and contact information for the source of the language.

OSF Response on 11/12/2010: The RFP language was finalized by the Office of State Finance. Standard state clauses and terms were utilized in many sections. Leon Kappelman, of the University of North Texas, provided input during the development of the RFP. Jim McGoodwin, as mentioned above, is the contact person regarding this information.

3. The correspondence files, written and/or electronic, between Capgemini, or a representative thereof, and 1) Michael Clingman; 2) Alex Pettit; 3) Rep. Jason Murphey; 4) Rep. David Derby; 5) Rep. Chris Benge; 6) Rep. Jason Nelson; 7) Senator Glenn Coffee; 8) Senator Todd Lamb; 9) Senator Mike Mazzei; 10) and Senator Clark Jolley, between the dates of January 1, 2008 and October 31, 2010.

OSF Response 11/12/2010: Again OSF has no access to any of the records of the Oklahoma House of Representatives or the Oklahoma State Senate. Requests for those records should be addressed to those entities or to the Representatives and Senators directly. As previously stated the Legislature is not subject to the Oklahoma Open Records Act, but may voluntarily provide the information/documents requested. We are in the process of pulling these records for the Office of State Finance and anticipate it will take until approximately November 19, 2010 to obtain this material.

4. Please advise me of the receipt of this request. In addition, please provide a time you expect these records to be available.

OSF Response 11/12/2010: On the afternoon of November 10, 2010 notification of receipt was provided. The response (#3) indicates we expect completion of this request November 19, 2010.

Below are the documents provided in response to the above open records request. The Office of State Finance, via the helpdesk, did provide their portion of the Open Records request by Nov. 19, 2010, despite the fact that they were moving offices.
