-A Joint Resolution directing the Secretary of State to refer to the people for their approval or rejection the repeal of Sections 2, 3 and 4 of Article XXV of the Constitution of the State of Oklahoma and a proposed amendment to the Constitution of the State of Oklahoma adding a new section to Article XXV to be designated as Section 6; providing for the creation of a department to administer human services for the people; providing ballot title; and directing filing.

SUBJECT: Department to administer human services and public welfare

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES AND THE SENATE OF THE 2ND SESSION OF THE 53RD OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:

SECTION 1. The Secretary of State shall refer to the people for their approval or rejection, as and in the manner provided by law, the repeal of Sections 2, 3 and 4 of Article XXV of the Constitution of the State of Oklahoma which relate to the Oklahoma Public Welfare Commission and the Director of Public Welfare.

SECTION 2. The Secretary of State shall refer to the people for their approval or rejection, as and in the manner provided by law, the following proposed amendment to the Constitution of the State of Oklahoma by adding a new Section 6 to Article XXV thereof, to read as follows:

Section 6. For the purpose of effectively administering and carrying into execution all laws enacted pursuant to the authority granted in Section 1 of this Article, the Legislature is hereby authorized to create a department or departments charged with the duty and responsibility of faithfully administering and carrying into execution all laws enacted pursuant to the authority granted in Section 1 of this Article and shall perform such other duties as may, from time to time, be prescribed by law.

SECTION 3. The Ballot Title for the proposed Constitutional amendment as set forth in SECTIONS 1 and 2 of this resolution shall be in the following form:

THE GIST OF THE PROPOSITION IS AS FOLLOWS:

This measure amends the State Constitution. It provides for the repeal of Sections 2, 3 and 4 of Article 25 which relate to the Department of Public Welfare, the Oklahoma Public Welfare Commission and the Director of Public Welfare. This measure grants the Legislature the authority to create and direct by law the administration of a department or departments to provide for public welfare for the people of the State of Oklahoma.

• it does not explain that the measure abolishes the Department of Human Services, the Commission for Human Services and the position of Director of Human Services which were created by the Oklahoma Constitution.

Having found that the Ballot Title does not comply with applicable laws, we will, in accordance with the provisions of 34 O.S.2011, § 9(C), within ten (10) business days, prepare a Ballot Title which complies with the law.

PRELIMINARY BALLOT TITLE FOR STATE QUESTION NO. 765

The measure amends the Oklahoma Constitution. It abolishes the Oklahoma Department of Human Services, the Oklahoma Commission of Human Services and the position of Director of the Oklahoma Department of Human Services. These entities were created under different names by Sections 2, 3 and 4 of Article 25 of the Oklahoma Constitution and given duties and responsibilities related to the care of the aged and needy. The measure repeals these sections of the Constitution and consequently, removes the power of the Commission of Human Services to establish policy and adopt rules and regulations. Under the measure, the Legislature and the people by initiative petition retain the power to adopt legislation for these purposes.

The measure adds a provision to the Constitution authorizing the Legislature to create a department or departments to administer and carry out laws to provide for the care of the aged and the needy. The measure also authorizes the Legislature to enact laws requiring the newly-created department or departments to perform other duties.

The measure amends the Oklahoma Constitution. Dear Speaker Steele:

I received a letter from you late yesterday addressing your concerns with the Preliminary Ballot Title for State Question No. 765, Legislative Referendum No. 362, reconstituting the - Department of Human Services. You ask that the final ballot title include language addressing the passage of HB 3137 which redefines the duties and requirements of the Department of Human Services, subject to passage of the constitutional amendment.

Pursuant to 34 O.S. 2011, § 9(B), a ballot title is to explain, in basic words, the effect of the constitutional amendment. To comply with this requirement, the final ballot title includes specific language that the Legislature has the power to adopt legislation and that the Legislature may "create a department or departments to administer and carry out laws to provide for the care of the aged and the needy." This language is sufficient to explain the effect of the measure as required by law. The specific language in HB 3137 is not a part of the constitutional amendment and is subject to change by this Legislature or subsequent legislatures. Therefore, I have not included language from this legislation as part of the ballot title.
